

The Western Cape is currently experiencing a water crisis as a result of a severe drought and declining dam levels. As a result, the City of Cape Town municipality has implemented **Level 5 water restrictions**.

Level 5 water restrictions require all water users to use **NO MORE THAN 87 LITRES** of municipal drinking water per person per day **IN TOTAL**, irrespective of whether you are at home, work, or elsewhere.

We are asking all guests to please be extra cautious when using water whilst in our region. It is for this reason we have **removed the bath plugs, and ask that you please shower**. However, should a guest have a condition that requires s/he to bath, a plug will be made available.

In addition, bed linen and bath towels are freshly laundered for our guests' arrival. Historically, our standard was to change bed linen and bath towels every second day and again after check-out. **In light of the water crisis, bed linen and bath towels will only be changed upon request during a guest's stay.**

Due to the water restrictions the **swimming pool is temporarily closed**.

We wish to thank guests in advance for their understanding and for contributing to our water saving efforts.
